At 15ft by 7ft, The Nutshell Pub in Bury St Edmunds is officially Britain's Smallest Pub The Abbey Gardens was originally laid out in the same style as the Royal Botanic Gardens in Brussels.

Charles Dickens stayed at The Angel Hotel in Bury St Edmunds three times during the 1800s. His favourite room, 215, is now known as the Charles Dickens room, and still

Bury holds the earliest known sundial designed for GMT. The pillar sundial and planter in the Abbey Gardens was originally designed as a drinking fountain and donated to the town in 1869 by the third Marquess of Bristol

contains the original four-poster bed he slept in!

Bury St Edmunds' town motto is 'Sacrarium Regis, Cunabula Legis' (Shrine of the King, cradle of the Law), reflecting its links with King
